Describe how the funds will increase or improve services for unduplicated pupils to improve A-G eligibility:	
<p>Grant dollars are budgeted to provide expanded training for teachers instructing Advanced Placement (AP) course sections, and improving the use of instructional strategies and systems designed to support the learning of low income students, English Learners, and foster youth in not only successfully completing these courses but also generating a qualifying score on AP testing. We will provide access to AP training to our teachers, in order to better align instruction between these course formats and increase success in AP testing and courses. Additional funding will also be dedicated to developing and implementing CTE courses for our students. OFY-San Gabriel will provide the opportunity to bring a more diverse A-G course offerings and make CTE Nursing courses available the support of this grant funding. Grant dollars will also be budgeted to increase the awareness and opportunities towards A-G completion through identified professional development opportunities for our teachers and post-secondary counselors to create a diverse understanding of requirements to ensure that students have attained a body of general knowledge that will provide breadth and perspective to new, more advanced study. Lastly, OFY-San Gabriel plans to work with California College Guidance Initiative to streamline our college readiness platform. Partnering with CaliforniaColleges.edu, the State of California's official college and career planning platform, we offer a unique suite of college, career and financial aid planning information, curricula, and tools. From exploring potential career paths to launching and tracking college and financial aid applications, CaliforniaColleges.edu helps students discover their college and career goals, make plans for how to achieve them, and launch into fulfilling futures.</p>	
A description of the extent to which all students, including foster youth, low-income students, and English learners, will have access to A-G courses approved by the University of California:	
<p>OFY-San Gabriel students, including foster youth, low-income students, and English Learners, have access to A-G courses in multiple modalities: digital and paper curriculum packets. The courses can also be verified using the UC Doorways Course List. Students meet often and regularly with both a teacher and post-secondary counselor to discuss course progress, course completion, and meeting the requirements of their A-G planning guide. OFY-San Gabriel plans to expand A-G core course offerings, which will include AP courses, CTE and college readiness cohorts.</p>	
The number of students who were identified for opportunities to retake A-G approved courses in which they received a "D", "F", or "Fail" grade in the 2020 spring semester or the 2020-21 school year and a description of the method used to offer the opportunity retake courses:	
<p>Number of students identified with a "D", "F", or "Fail" in the 2020-21 School Year: 449</p> <p>During the 2020 - 21 school year, 449 students received a D or F grade in one or more A-G courses. Options for Youth San Gabriel an extended school year calendar affording every student the opportunity to recover credit loss and more one-on-one support towards academic goals. Students have the opportunity to complete more courses through our extended school calendar. Credit recovery is offered via Edmentum during the school year, giving students access to continue working on their subjects outside school hours.</p>	
Describe how the plan and described services and associated expenditures, if applicable, supplement services in the Local Control and Accountability Plan and Learning Recovery Plan:	

Options for Youth San Gabriel intends to use the funds from the A-G Completion Improvement Grant to supplement the services that the school is already providing to students as outlined in our school's LCAP. While our LCAP allocates resources to support professional development for teachers, academic and postsecondary planning, and college-focused opportunities for all students, the A-G Grant funds will allow us to increase accessibility to A-G coursework for all students with an emphasis on our unduplicated students among all students, including foster youth, low-income students, and English learners.. In addition, it will allow us to increase our A-G Completion rate by providing additional professional development

The related LCAP goals and actions for Options for Youth San Gabriel are outlined below:

LCAP Goal 2 - Action 1 Professional Development Opportunities: Instructional staff will attend internally / external professional development opportunities on an annual basis to better equip them to provide individualized, standards-aligned instruction, intervention support and/or resource implementation including but not limited to specific EL professional development.

LCAP Goal 2 - Action 3 Targeted Specialized Instructional Support: Students will have access to specialized instructional support to help aid their progression, identify learning gaps, and help close the achievement gap by implementing strategies such as integrated instruction for EL students, as well as labs and added time to target attendance issues for FY and Homeless and Low Income students.
